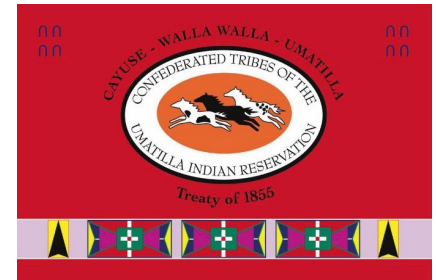

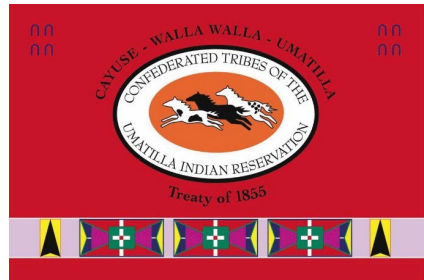

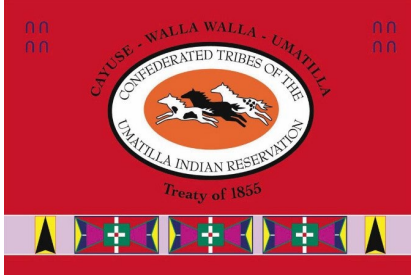

## Our Obstacles, Our Solutions

Universal obstacles? Two categories:

### Systemic

- Lack of personnel (difficulties hiring or little funding), time, or other resources
- Contract obligations time consuming (e.g. DMMM, meetings, reporting)
- Finance process slow, slows everything

### Data Product Development and Management

- Communication & expectations: lack of feedback
- Iterative development needs limits, a little less iteration
- Updates? Difficult to implement, maintain, complex

## Some proposed solutions?

- Use contractors to fill data professional roles
- Reduce contract obligations – fewer meetings, less reporting (e.g. DMMM)
- Develop internal systems for data management/governance to, for example, impose rules for development processes – including acceptance, testing, buy-in process
